

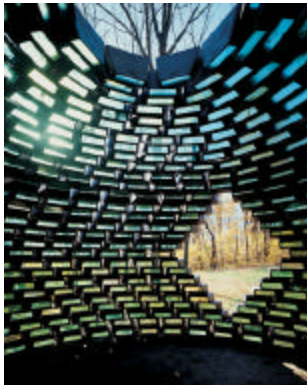
## Steve Tobin

Born in 1957, Steve Tobin is a sculptor working and living outside of Coopersburg, PA. He became fascinated by glass and glass-making as a teenager in a physics class, leading to set up his own "studio" at home to make glass objects. He studied physics and math at Tulane, but continued to explore the artistic aspects of glass. His first showing was the year of his graduation.



In the 70's, 80's and early 90's, Steve created innovative and ambitious sculptures and installations in glass. He exhibited the work extensively in museums and galleries worldwide including a solo exhibit at SOFA.

He then left the Gallery scene and focused mostly on Museum Exhibits and on broadening his horizons within the art world, with several notable shows in the US, Europe and Japan.



Tobin has worked in a variety of mediums that include blown and cast glass and clay to steel and bronze, as well as fireworks tubes and animal bones.

Steve has participated in numerous solo and group exhibitions from New York to Arizona, and Switzerland to Finland. His work is in the collections of museums such as the American Craft Museum in New York, the Art Museum, the White House, and corporate collections such as Coca-Cola and Finnair.

He has participated in a two-man show with Marc Chagall and received grants from the Finnish and American governments to pay for a show of 200 of his works.
